The 559 area code serves Central California and includes all or portions of Fresno, Kings, Madera, Mariposa, Merced and Tulare counties. The 559 area code serves communities such as Clovis, Coalinga, Fresno, Madera, Porterville, Reedley, Selma and Visalia, as well as some unincorporated areas. The new 357 area code will serve the same geographic area currently served by the existing 559 area code.

The addition of the 357 area code will require a new dialing procedure for anyone with a 559 or 357 area code. To complete calls from a landline phone, anyone with a 559 or 357 area code must dial 1+ area code + telephone number. This means that all calls from a 559 area code that are currently dialed with 7 digits will

need to be dialed using the new 1 + area code + telephone number dialing procedure.

To complete calls from a cellular or mobile phone, callers may dial area code + telephone number or 1 + area code + telephone number whenever placing a call from a phone number with the 559 or 357 area code.

Beginning Feb. 26, 2025, customers with a 559 area code must use the new dialing procedure, even for local calls within the same area code. On and after this date, 7digit calls will not be completed, and a recording will instruct the caller to hang up and dial again.

Beginning Mar. 26, 2025, new telephone lines or



services in the 559 area may be assigned numbers from the new 357 area code. Anyone assigned a new 357 area code telephone number must use the new dialing procedure.

Key Facts

Below are some key facts about the 559/357 area code overlay:

• Telephone numbers, including the current area code, will not change.

• The price of a call, coverage area, or other rates and services will not change due to the overlay.

• What is a local call now will remain a local call.

• Customers in the overlay region will dial 1+10 digits for local calls within and between the overlay area codes, and 1+10 digits for long distance calls.

• Customers still can dial just three digits to reach 911 and 988, as well as 211, 311, 411, 511, 611, 711, or 811 if those are currently available in their community.

How to Prepare

• Customers should ensure that all services, automatic dialing equipment, or other types of equipment that are currently programmed to dial 7 digits are reprogrammed to dial 1+ area code + telephone number. Some examples include, but are not limited to: stored telephone numbers in contact lists in wireless or cordless phones, PBXs, fax machines, Internet dial-up numbers, speed dialers, call forwarding settings, voicemail services, medical alert devices, safety alarm security systems and gates, ankle monitors and/or other similar equipment. Customers should ensure such equipment is pro-

• Customers should ensure such equipment is grammed to recognize 357 as a valid area code.

• Customers should identify their telephone number as a 10-digit number (3-digit area code + 7-digit telephone number) and include the area code when giving the number to friends, family, business associates and others.

• Customers should ensure their websites, personal and business stationery, printed checks, advertising materials, contact information and personal or pet ID tags include the area code.

Two Students Transported with Minor Injuries

On Thursday, Feb. 13 at approximately 7:18 a.m., Madera Area CHP officers responded to a three-vehicle crash involving a Golden Valley Unified school bus at the intersection of Ave. 12 and Road 32. An 18year-old and 16-year-old student/passenger in the Golden Valley Unified school bus, whose parents arrived on-scene, were trans-



ported via ground ambulance to Valley Children's Hospital with complaints of pain.

Officers responded and learned that a 48-year-old female from Madera was driving the school bus with 29 students aboard. It had stopped and was waiting to make a right turn onto eastbound Ave. 12. At the same time, a 22-year-old female from Madera in a GMC was stopped on Ave. 12 due to westbound traffic ahead.

A 21-year-old male from Ceres was driving a Kenworth T60 and trailer combination, traveling westbound on Ave. 12 when the driver of the Kenworth observed stopped traffic ahead and applied his brakes but he began to skid/slide, and the driver turned the Kenworth to the right, in an attempt to avoid a crash with the GMC. The left rear of the Kenworth's trailer crashed into the right rear of the GMC, pushing the GMC into the eastbound lane of Ave. 12 as the school bus was making its right turn to eastbound Ave. 12. As a result, the left front of the GMC crashed into the left side of the school bus. All drivers were wearing their seat belts.

Alcohol and/or drugs are not suspected to be a factor in this crash.

EPA Administrator Lee Zeldin just sent California's vehicle emissions waiver request to Congress for review. This is big and kills California Governor Gavin Newsom's ban on gas-powered vehicles.

In December, the Environmental Protection Agency, on orders from the Biden administration, announced that they approved California's mandate to ban the sale of all gas-powered vehicles by 2035, attempting to make it more difficult for President Donald Trump to federally stop the mandate once he took office, the Globe reported.

California's strictest-in-the-nation vehicle regulations require manufacturers to comply with the state's much more stringent emissions standards, and to produce more zero-emission vehicles for the state. However, this is usually sent to Congress prior to authorization.

Enter EPA Administrator Lee Zeldin who on Friday lifted the order and sent California's waiver request to Congress for review:

way Traffic Safety Administration.

"The Biden Administration failed to send rules on California's waivers to Congress, preventing Members of Congress from deciding on extremely consequential actions that have massive impacts and costs across the entire United States. The Trump EPA is transparently correcting this wrong and rightly following the rule of law," said Zeldin. "The American people are struggling to make ends meet while dealing with rules that take away their ability to choose a safe and affordable vehicle for their families. As an agency, we are accountable to Congress, but most importantly we must be accountable to the American people."

The EPA rules granting California waivers transmitted to Congress include California's Advanced Clean Cars II, Advanced Clean Trucks, and Omnibus NOx rules. The two waivers regarding trucks not only increased the cost of those vehicles but also increased the costs of goods and the cost of living for American families across the country.

As the Globe reported, it was only in January that the benevolent California Air Resources Board had the good sense to withdraw the federal waiver to enact emissions limits that exceed federal standards, and would require California truck drivers to transition from diesel to electric trucks.

This was about to go into effect, but in anticipation of the upcoming Trump administration the CARB actually read the room.

Gov. Newsom hasn't done that yet.

There was nothing "groundbreaking" about California's or the EPA's Advanced Clean Fleets rule. CARB aimed to achieve a total zero-emissions truck and bus fleet by 2045, as well as have at least 1.6 million zero-emission medium- and heavyduty trucks operating in the state by 2048.

"State officials have long considered the rules essential to cleaning up California's severe air pollution and combating climate change," CalMatters reported, obviously upset about the federal waiver forcing big rigs to go all-electric being dropped.

Where is California's severe air pollution? Who in California is experiencing climate change? It's probably more important to listen to those in the trucking industry than a reporter paid to write "about the impacts of climate change and air pollution and California's policies to tackle them."

The Commercial Carrier Journal reported, "The state of California has withdrawn its remaining outstanding request for waivers that would have allowed the state to enact emissions limits that exceed federal standards as the sun sets on President Joe Biden's administration, which had been an ally in the state's fight for some of the world's most stringent air quality regulations."

In August, 21 Republican Lawmakers from the California Senate and Assembly increased pressure on Governor Gavin Newsom to change up his Advanced Clean Fleets mandate because of multiple electric vehicle fires caused by lithium-ion batteries that occurred in the past month, the Globe reported.

Zeldin announced his "Powering the Great American Comeback" initiative to guide EPA's work to protect human health and the environment while restoring the greatness of the American economy for the first 100 days and beyond. Today's action advances two of the five pillars of this initiative: Permitting Reform, Cooperative Federalism and Cross-Agency Partnership, and Protecting and Bringing Back American Auto Jobs.

Sheriff Anderson Passes Away

Former Madera County Sheriff John Anderson passed away on Jan. 31, 2025 at his home in Nipomo. Sheriff Anderson dedicated more than five decades to law enforcement, leaving a lasting impact on our community and the state of California.

In 1998, John was elected as Madera County Sheriff, a position he held for 16 years until his retirement in 2014. He launched the Madera County Narcotic Enforcement Team (MADNET) in 1999 to combat drug-related issues in our community. He also initiated the "Save Our Seniors" (SOS-911) program, providing seniors with cell phones for emergency use, and was instrumental in developing the MC-Alert system to keep residents informed during emergencies.

In 1999, Sheriff Anderson established the Citizens on Patrol (COP) program, a volunteer unit trained to perform duties such as patrolling neighborhoods, assisting deputies at crime scenes, and conducting vacation checks of residences. This program empowered community members to play an active role in public safety and support the work of deputies in the field.

His legacy of service, innovation, and dedication will continue to inspire all who had the privilege of working with him. As we mourn his loss, let us also celebrate his life and the indelible mark he left on our community.

Liberal Women Least Happy?

Parks

A new poll shows liberal women are the most unhappy and lonely. Liberal women between the ages of 18-40 are nearly three times as likely as conservative peers to report frequent feelings of loneliness.

Professor and author Brad

Wilcox, a sociology professor at the University of Virginia and fellow at the Institute for Family Studies, spoke with Fox News Digital about the latest research on what makes women Liberal happy. women are the least likely to report being fully

satisfied with their lives and are far more likely to report feeling lonely often, according to analysis from a recently published poll.

The 2024 American Family Survey reportedly found that 37 percent of conservative women and 28 percent of moderate women, between the ages of 18-40, reported being "completely satisfied" with their lives, but just 12 percent of liberal women in the same age



By Elizabeth Heckman and Kristine group said the same. Liberal women were also nearly three times more likely than conservative women to say they experienced loneliness at least a few times a week.

> Wilcox, who analyzed the survey's data, said he believes there are a couple of reasons why conservative young

> > women are more likely to be happier than their liberal counterparts.

'We've seen in the research that conservative women tend to be more likely to embrace a sense of agency and to have the sense that they are not, in any way, the victim of larger structural realities or forces," he told Fox News Digi-

contributes to happiness.

"They're also less likely to 'catastrophize' about public events and concerns," and "more likely to think of themselves as captains of their own fate," Wilcox added. He also broke down the poll by the relationship status of the women surveyed.

According to his analysis, 40 percent of liberal women reported being single, while 31 percent said they were married. For conservative women, 33 percent reported being single and 51 percent were married. The remaining women on both sides of the political aisle reported being "in a committed relationship" or "cohabiting" with a partner.

Wilcox told Fox News Digital that marriage and family are an "enormous' source of meaning and purpose for most people, so it's not surprising that conservative women, who are more likely to be married, would also feel more satisfied with their lives in general. Conservative women are also more likely to embrace the gender differences between men and women and prioritize family and attending religious services, he said, which also contributes to happiness.

The American Family Survey is an annual, nationwide survey of 3,000 Americans. The 2024 poll was released in early February 2025 and conducted August 22-29, 2024.

If you have ever been to a mixer, you know that we go around the room introducing ourselves and telling a little about what we do. At this party, I introduced myself and told what I do for the Ranchos Independent, namely writing the column Aunt Jean's Ranchos Recipes, and that I am always looking for new recipes and would love to have anyone there volunteer their favorite recipe. Since it is still chilly outside, I mentioned that my next column was going to be about a good bowl of hot soup with maybe a loaf of French bread to warm up everybody. With that, little Wyatt spoke up and said he had a soup recipe he would give me. I wanted to ask him about his recipe that night but they had to leave before I could talk to him. - Black-eyed Pea Chowder
- 1/2 lb. diced bacon or ham
- 2 C chopped celery
- 2 C chopped green pepper
- 1 C chopped onion
- $1 \ 10\frac{1}{2}$ oz. can beef stock
- 2 16 oz. cans diced tomatoes 2 16 oz. cans black eyed peas

Sauté bacon or ham with celery, green pepper and onion. Add stock, tomatoes and peas. Simmer 30 to 40 min. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

Kale must be the "in" vegetable now. On TV, I have seen it cooked just about every way imaginable: steamed, sautéed, boiled, baked and even fried. When I found this recipe and saw kale in it, I thought it sounded good.

Kale and Bean Soup

- 2 medium onions chopped
- 2 C cubed peeled potatoes
- 1 T olive oil
- 4 garlic cloves, minced

1 bunch kale, trimmed and coarsely chopped

3¹/₂ C vegetable stock

1 28 oz. can diced tomatoes,

- 1¹/₂ C water
- 1 tsp. Italian seasoning
- 1 tsp. paprika
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 1 bay leaf

1 15 oz. can white kidney or drained

in the fields. One necessary element that kept cattle safe and home properties free from cow pies was fencing. Both sides of the fence had value.

Sometimes when a goose and a finch share space without boundaries, the finch feels like there's no space to roam freely, or the goose feels overtaken ing a "V" formation just to annoy with cow pies.

If there's a spare room that can be designated as finch's space, the magical margin is the door that the goose can close when she doesn't want to see it. If that's not possible, a rolling cart with the finch's stuff might be used in common spaces and rolled into a closet or garage when hosting guests.

Whether it's a basket on the kitchen counter for the keys and wallet, or a tray in the bathroom for daily used items, these magical margins keep the finch's belongings accessible while providing a sense of order for the goose.

Remember — a goose isn't flya finch any more than a finch flies randomly to annoy a goose. We're wired differently. Sometimes it's the same differences that attract us to one another that drive us crazy. What then? With communication. flexibility and grace we learn to co-exist with random rhythms and magical margins.

Weather Update in Madera

Feeling this winter passing by too fast, one can't stop wondering about the shortand long-term effects on us. During the rainy season, Madera had an unusual winter. Normally, Madera's winters are mild, although nighttime temperatures will drop below 30 degrees to the freezing point with January high temperatures averaging around 54° F and about 2.21 inches of rain for the month. spite the considerable distance between the two regions. One notable impact has been the mobilization of Madera residents to support those affected by the fires. Individuals with ties to Los Angeles have initiated efforts to send aid to the victims, demonstrating the interconnectedness and solidarity among California communities.

Additionally, the economic repercussions of the Los Angeles fires may have broader implications for the state, potentially affecting areas like Madera. The Los Angeles Economic Development Corporation estimates that the recent wildfires have caused approximately \$53.8 billion in property damage based on market value. What will the insurance industry effect eventually be on our community? Such significant economic impacts could influence state resources and policies, indirectly affecting communities throughout California.

However, this time, the area faced a long drought, making the soil drier and increasing the need for irrigation. On top of that, strong Santa Ana winds, which are not common in this area, made things worse by raising evaporation rates and increasing wildfire risks. These conditions have created big challenges for all of us, especially for the large number of farmers in Madera who have had to deal with water shortages and threats to their crops.

This reduced soil moisture, coupled with heightened irrigation demands, means less water is available to percolate down and replenish the groundwater aquifers. Over time, this could lead to a notable decline in groundwater levels, making it more challenging for the region to meet agricultural and residential water needs. The persistent dryness also increases the risk of over-extraction, further stressing the already fragile groundwater system. Sustainable water management practices managed by Madera County will be crucial to mitigate these impacts and ensure the long-term availability of our groundwater in Madera.

I also wanted to touch on the effect the latest Los Angeles wildfires had on our remote, but still close, community.

The recent wildfires in Los Angeles have had indirect effects on Madera, de-

While Madera has not experienced direct physical effects from the Los Angeles fires, the situation underscores the importance of statewide preparedness and mutual support in the face of natural disasters.
